# Ask Sue

A few months ago, I spoke at the Capital Valley IPSSA introducing Pentair's new Energy Audit tool for use on tablets and PCs. Questions came up that I thought that I would share with you, as more and more of you are starting to conduct energy audits for your customers.

First, let me tell you what this tool does. The Energy Audit Calculator is an advanced audit tool that is used on a mobile tablet or computer. It will estimate a pool owner's current energy costs from pumps and lights and compare it to the savings they can expect with a Pentair IntelliFlo pump and LED lights. It's also possible to enter actual figures for TDS and energy consumption. To enter an actual Total Dynamic Head figure for the calculation, take the Vacuum and Pressure readings from the existing pump and calculate TDH. If you have a watt meter, take a reading and plug that in. The tool can provide estimates based on other information. Also, a list of pumps used in the market today is built right into the calculator.

A report (which is formatted for printing) will display the energy savings in several ways: pie charts, the ever-famous light bulb chart, a return-on-investment chart, and a recap of all the data from the audit. What I like about this calculator is that it gives you a professional looking printout to share with the homeowner.

# Does anyone use a Vacuum and Pressure gauge to conduct an audit?

Some people guesstimate the TDH (resistance in the system) and others use gauges. The calculator is designed to be used either way. I like using the gauges for the actual readings from each system, as it is customized to the characteristics of a specific pool. It is an easy thing to do, it doesn't take very long, and it leaves a professional imprint in the customer's mind. I think I could compare it to quickly squirting OTO onto the pool surface to "test the pool" rather than using a 6-in-1 test kit to measure and monitor the overall balance of the pool. A TDH guesstimate will probably give you enough information in most situations, but getting the actual readings is more professional and more accurate.

### How do I get the tool on my device?

This new tool can be downloaded from the Pentair website – www.pentairpool.com. Select the Pool Professional box, click on Calculate, and select "Energy Audit Calculator" (the one listed first). If you are a first-time user, sign up by providing your info and email address and setting up a password. If you are a returning

user, just log in. Click on "Launch the Energy Audit Calculator." This tool is designed for use on a tablet device. If you wish to use this tool on your laptop, it requires Google Chrome, which is a free download. If you don't have Google Chrome, you may need to install it. For those of you that do not



# Salt pools watch your alkalinity

Service techs know that keeping the proper pH level in a salt water pool is tough. But as you constantly add acid you are probably lowering total alkalinity and putting the plaster at risk of etching. Tip - keep an eye on total alkalinity, especially at your salt water pools to avoid turning the water aggressive.







# Ask Ray... Answers to recent questions asked to

#### **Question:**

One of our accounts has asked us to sign a "Pool Compliance Form" that states "Pool Contractor certifies that that pool located at this HOA complies with all local, State and Federal laws, which include but are not limited to the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act, AB2114, California Code of Regulations Title 24 (signs and flow indicators), and other requirements such as safety information, number of persons allowed in the pool/spa areas, safety ring and other equipment, etc." The HOA is very insistent. Should we sign it?

#### **Answer:**

You are not the first pool service technician that has been presented a form like this. I may be cynical, but I think the real purpose of the form is to provide the HOA with a defense in the event of a fine or accident at the pool. If you sign the form I predict that the HOA will claim that they relied on your assurance that the pool was in full compliance and that the HOA would have made any modifications if you had properly advised them. You could be liable for any fines levied to the HOA's fines and any damages for injuries. Keep in mind that you are certifying that the pool complies with ALL laws. You had better start reading the law books right away!

# **UV** Index scale

The UV Index scale used in the United States conforms with international guidelines for UVI reporting established by the World Health Organization. Learn how to read the UV index Scale to help you avoid harmful exposure to UV radiation.

#### 0 to 2: Low

A UV Index reading of 0 to 2 means low danger from the sun's

UV rays for the average person.

- Wear sunglasses on bright lays.
- If you burn easily, cover up and use broad spectrum SPF 30+ sunscreen.
- Watch out for bright surfaces, like sand, water and snow, which reflect UV and increase exposure.

3 to 5: Moderate

A UV Index reading of 3 to 5

means moderate risk of harm from unprotected sun exposure.

- Stay in shade near midday when the sun is strongest.
- If outdoors, wear protective clothing, a wide-brimmed hat, and UV-blocking sunglasses.
- Generously apply broad spectrum SPF 30+ sunscreen every 2 hours, even on cloudy days, and after swimming or sweating.
- Watch out for bright surfaces, like sand, water and snow, which

reflect UV and increase exposure.

6 to 7: High

A UV Index reading of 6 to 7 means high risk of harm from unprotected sun exposure. Protection against skin and eye damage is needed.

- Reduce time in the sun between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- If outdoors, seek shade and wear protective clothing, a widebrimmed hat, and UV-blocking sunglasses.
- Generously apply broad spectrum SPF 30+ sunscreen every 2 hours, even on cloudy days, and after swimming or sweating.
- Watch out for bright surfaces, like sand, water and snow, which reflect UV and increase exposure.

8 to 10: Very High

A UV Index reading of 8 to 10 means very high risk of harm from unprotected sun exposure. Take extra precautions because unprotected skin and eyes will be dam-

aged and can burn quickly.

- Minimize sun exposure between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- If outdoors, seek shade and wear protective clothing, a wide-brimmed hat, and UV-blocking sunglasses.
- Generously apply broad spectrum SPF 30+ sunscreen every 2 hours, even on cloudy days, and after swimming or sweating.
- Watch out for bright surfaces, like sand, water and snow, which reflect UV and increase exposure.

#### 11 or more: Extreme

A UV Index reading of 11 or more means extreme risk of harm from unprotected sun exposure. Take all precautions because unprotected skin and eyes can burn in minutes.

- Try to avoid sun exposure between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- If outdoors, seek shade and wear protective clothing, a wide-





Glossary of important electrical definitions:

ACCESSIBLE: Capable of being reached quickly for operation renewal or inspections. All electrical controls (i.e. time clock, disconnect) must have a two foot clearance in front of it.

AMPACITY: Maximum current in amperes that a conductor can carry continuously.

APPROVED: All electrical equipment must be approved by UL (Underwriters Lab) or the authority having jurisdiction.

BONDING: Establishes an effective path for fault current as in a short.

BRANCH CIRCUIT: The circuit conductors between the final over current device (circuit breaker or fuse) protecting the circuit and the outlets.

CIRCUIT BREAKER: A device designed to open and close a circuit by non-automatic means and to open the circuit automatically predetermined overcurrent without damage to itself without properly applied within its rating.

CONTINOUS LOAD: A load where the maximum circuit is expected to continue for three hours or more as in swimming pool motors.

DEADE FRONT: Without live parts exposed to a person on the operating side of the equipment (time clock or circuit breaker box).

brimmed hat, and UV-blocking sunglasses.

- Generously apply broad spectrum SPF 30+ sunscreen every 2 hours, even on cloudy days, and after swimming or sweating.
- Watch out for bright surfaces, like sand, water and snow, which reflect UV and increase exposure.

#### The Shadow Rule

An easy way to tell how much UV exposure you are getting is to look for your shadow:

- If your shadow is taller than you are (in the early morning and late afternoon), your UV exposure is likely to be lower.
- If your shadow is shorter than you are (around midday), you are being exposed to higher levels of UV radiation. Seek shade and protect your skin and eyes.

# Know your electrical code

DEVICE: A unit of an electrical system that carries or controls electrical energy as its principal function (i.e. switches, circuit breakers, fuse holders, receptacles, and lamp holders).

DISCONNECTING MEANS: A device or group of devices or other means by which the conductors of a circuit can be disconnected from their source of supply (i.e. switches, circuit breakers).

FITTING: A fitting is an accessory such as a locknut, bushing or other part of a wiring system that is intended primarily to perform a mechanical rather than an electrical function.

G.F.C.I: A device intended for the protection of personnel that functions to de-energize a circuit or portion thereof within an established period of time where a current to ground exceeds the values established for a Class A device. A Class A Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter trips when the current to ground is 6 mA (milliamps).

A GROUNDING CONDUCTOR: The green of bare or green/yellow wire installed to connect normally non-current carrying metal parts of equipment together and to the system grounded conductor or to the grounding electrode conductor or both (ground rod or foundation ground).

GOUNDING ELECTRODE CONDUCTOR: A conductor used to connect the system grounded conductor or the equipment to a grounding electrode or to a point on the grounding electrode system.

IN SIGHT: Where the codes

specifies that the disconnect shall not be further that 50 feet away and within sight for pool equipment.







investigate and document the positive health consequences of aquatic exercise against maladies such as, but not limited to, high blood pressure, diabetes, obesity, heart disease, cancer, aging, physical therapy and arthritis. Her preliminary goal will educate public health officials and swimming/

aquatics agencies on the most appropriate and safe methods to assess participants, taking into account an individual's health history and baseline level of fitness. Nagle added, "I hope that as my research agenda continues to develop over the next few years, I will be able to execute a number of follow-on studies to examine the effects of an aquatic exercise intervention on improving cardiovascular fitness, long-term weight loss, exercise participation, and quality of life in normal vs. over-

### Matching funds available from IPSSA Inc.

IPSSA Inc. has a matching grant fund of \$24,000 to assist individual regions and chapters for community involvement, safety programs, and promoting IPSSA to the public. The spirit of the matching grant is to foster IPSSA promotions by facilitating new ideas from individual members, chapters and regions.

The matching grant funds shall be allocated evenly by region in each given year. In the event that a region does not request funds in a given year, that region's representative may elect to reallocate their portion to the matching grant fund for redistribution. Any redistribution of funds must be approved by the BORD.

The BORD will match, dollar for dollar, up to the budget amount once a matching grant is approved by the regional Board.

Each region shall determine how to use its allotment of funds without BORD approval once it has been approved by the regional Board.

Individual members, chapters and regions of IPSSA in good standing qualify for matching grants.
